About the draft government data register

Stats NZ is leading the development of a data investment plan to ensure government has the data it needs to assess the wellbeing of New Zealanders and the state of our economy and environment. The plan aims to improve the supply and management of our government data assets through more careful investment. It will:

- set out a long-term view of the essential data we need and when we need it
- inform government investment in maintaining and improving existing data
- identify where government investment is needed to fill critical data gaps.

A data asset stocktake is underway, and the initial draft data register provided here consolidates existing datasets included in three government frameworks:

- Ngā Tūtohu Aotearoa Indicators Aotearoa New Zealand
- Treasury's Living Standards Framework
- Tier 1 Statistics.

The register lists current essential datasets which are highly important statistical or data products.

Fields in the data register

ID	Unique identifier
Category	A 3-level classification describing the purpose of the dataset, based on the Tier 1 statistics taxonomy. Useful for searching for a dataset and for understanding how datasets relate to others.
Short title	A short descriptive name for the dataset.
URL link	A link to the actual dataset.
Framework	 The framework containing the dataset: IANZ: Ngā Tūtohu Aotearoa – Indicators Aotearoa New Zealand Living Standards: the Living Standards Framework Tier1: Tier 1 statistics
Organisation	The agency or organisation responsible for producing the dataset.
Frequency updated	How often the data is updated.
Technical specification	A technical description of the dataset.
Contextual information	Auxiliary information useful for analysing the data.
Data sources (1-30)	The data source(s) used to produce the dataset.
IANZ Domain	The IANZ domain the dataset relates to.

He Arotahi Tatauranga Domain	The domain in He Arotahi Tatauranga (Stats NZ's statistical framework for Māori information needs) that the dataset relates to.
LSF Domain	The Living Standards Framework domain the product relates to.

Living Standards Framework

The Living Standards Framework (LSF) represents the Treasury's perspective on what matters for New Zealanders' wellbeing, now and into the future.

The LSF is a flexible framework that prompts Treasury's thinking about policy impacts across the different dimensions of wellbeing, as well as the long-term and distributional issues and implications.

It includes:

- the 12 Domains of current wellbeing outcomes;
- the four Capital stocks that support wellbeing now and into the future; and
- risk and resilience.

Tier 1 Statistics

New Zealand's most important official statistics are known as 'Tier 1' statistics. Official statistics are any statistics that are, or could be, regularly published by government agencies.

Tier 1 statistics are essential for understanding how well New Zealand is performing. They inform critical decisions made by government, businesses, and the community.

Of high public interest, Tier 1 statistics are used to:

- measure our performance as a country
- inform critical decision-making
- compare ourselves internationally
- ensure we meet international statistical obligations.
